RUSSIANS WITHDRAW FROM GALICIA

Petrograd States a Retreat Was Carried Out at Two Points.

London, June 16—The latest air raid on the British coast was the most fatal of them all. Zeppelins flew over the northeast coast of England last night.

This morning 15 persons are dead from missiles thrown down by the flyers, and as many more are wounded.

Never before has an air raid on England taken such toll in human life. This is the third air attack in a little over two weeks.

May 31 was the date of the attack on London from the clouds when four persons were killed and five, June 5 the east coast of England was the scene of attack with five fatalities.

In the eastern arena of the fighting the Russian forces still are slowly and stubbornly retiring. The latest official report from Petrograd admits the withdrawal of Russian troops across the Galician frontier into Russian territory from Czernowitz, at a point between the Dniester and the Pruth.

The same report says that fresh German forces, brought up near Jaroslavl, under cover of heavy artillery fire, compelled the Russians to retire for some distance on the right bank of the River San, after three days of desperate fighting.

On the remainder of the eastern front the Russians apparently are contenting themselves with repelling the attacks of the enemy, excepting on the left banks of the Tisza and the Stry Rivers, tributaries of the Dniester, where they claim to have taken numerous prisoners and machine guns and to have recaptured villages wrested from them by the Austrians.

Little news comes to London from the Dardanelles, with the exception of the official intimation that the Turkish forces are showing a sensible weakening.

On the western front, the fighting during the past 24 hours has been decisive. According to Paris the most important activity has been confined to the artillery, but a wireless despatch from Berlin relates the complete failure of a violent French infantry attack to the north of Arras.

Germany is showing considerable bitterness, judging from despatches reaching London over the air raid yesterday on the city of Karlsruhe. The press is demanding retaliation.

On the other hand Paris reports officially that this raid was a reprisal for the dropping of bombs by the Germans on the city of London.

The following official statement was issued last night at the war office: "Fighting continues in the Shavi district without substantially modifying the situation.

"During Monday night the enemy delivered a futile attack in the direction of Nysynz and Bak as well as several isolated attacks in the district north of Przaszys, all of which we successfully repulsed."

"In Galicia the Germans made good their losses by bringing up fresh troops not before seen on this front, and they resumed the offensive in the Jaroslavl district on the right bank of the San, supported by a strong artillery fire. After three days of hard fighting we yielded some ground to the enemy on the right banks of the Lubazka and the Wyszynia, a tributary of the San.

"On the Dniester on Sunday we delivered a successful counter-attack on the left banks of the Tisza and the Stry Rivers. Here we made 1,200 prisoners, including 20 officers, and captured 7 machine guns. The same day the Germans attacked in the sector south of the bridgehead of Jidatcheff, taking the village of Rogouzhno. At dawn of the following day we delivered a counter-attack and recaptured the villages of Rogouzhno and Jouvavkoff. We secured also a gun with its equipment and several artilleriemmen.

In this engagement the Germans hoisted a white flag and treacherously opened fire. Consequently they were all bayoneted by our soldiers.

"The enemy continues his attacks on the bridgehead near Ninioff, employing strong forces of artillery to play this end. During last Sunday we repulsed these attacks and made over 1,500 prisoners.

"Between the Dniester and the Pruth, in the region of Czernowitz, we have withdrawn beyond our frontier.

London, June 16—A Copenhagen despatch to the Exchange Telegraph Company says the Swedish Steamer Verdan of 847 tons was torpedoed yesterday off Christiania Sound by a German submarine. A German cruiser took the crew abroad and shelled, without sinking the Verdan, which was timber laden.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male over 15 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres on certain conditions. A homestead patent may be obtained as soon as residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after certifying homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, sandy or rocky land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W.
