WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion laud in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberulne miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is prformed in the vscinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing many pre-empt a quarter section alongstide his homestead. Price \$3.90 per acre. WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years, after earning homestead patnt; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Precuption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions
