TRACKMEN'S STRIKE.

A Boy Instantly Killed and Much Damage Committee Ask Other Concessions in Addition to Increased Wages.

PORTLAND, Me., Jupe 12.—The gen-eral grievance committee today an-nounced that not only, is a demand made for an increase in-wages, but other concessions also are asked of the road. Some of them aro as follows : That ten hours shall constitute a day's work—the men to receive time and a half for all extra time and double time for Sunday; that no main-tenance of way or fuel, men shall be discharged for serving on any griev-ance committee, and that section men shall be allowed free use of company's dwellings, with fuel at points where men live in such dwellings. The exact increases demanded are as follows: Yard foremen and men on the sys-tem shall receive an increase of 25 cents per day, excepting yard foremen at Portland, Waterville, Bangor, Brunswick and Bath, who shall be paid not less than §250 per day ; foremen on Mountain and Quebec division shall not receive less than 35c, per day in-crease and even the Rockland branch section hands seven cents per day. This rule shall apply to all extra and fence gangs. All coal shovellers and hoisters on the entire system shall re-ceive a minimum of §1.75 per day. How Catarrh Poleons the System.
