A Big Colonization Scheme **Outlined for Sunbury County**

Premier Introduces Bill in Legislature to Provide for Settlement of 20,000 Acres—English Capitalists Associated with W. Leonard Palmer in Proposition,

200 families to be settled in a period of fitteen years.
