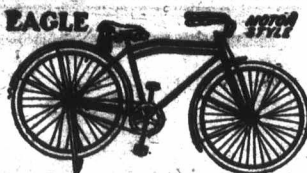

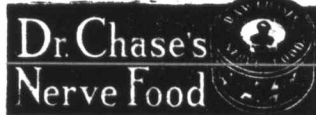

Temperance Alliance to Assist Referendum

(Continued from page 8)

Mr. Smith (Charlotte), Mr. Jones,
Mr. Dickson, Mr. Hunter —18.

Hon. Mr. Speaker declared the re-
solution carried as amended.

5. This province now enjoys the
reputation of being the
only one in the dominion whose leg-
islature has refused to vote upon
the question of total prohibition for rich
and poor alike. All that the legis-
lature was asked to do was to give
the people themselves the opportu-
nity to express their wishes, for there
is now no other way to stop the im-
portation of liquors into the province
until the house passes the resolution
and referendum vote is taken.

10. Your committee used its best
judgement and efforts to secure a
favorable vote and whilst we did not

succeed we have the satisfaction of
knowing that the responsibility for
its failure does not rest upon the
alliance. The responsibility for all
the ills arising from the present
condition of things will rest, and not
very lightly, upon the shoulders and
consciences of the men who refused
to the people the right to decide for
themselves what they wished.

11. Even the blindest and most ob-
stinate opponent of prohibition
knows what the end will be and that
it is only a temporary advantage the
liquor traffickers have gained. Soon
or or later all we are asking for will
be obtained.

12. It is for us to learn the lessons
the situation should teach us and
we need not, in the least, be discour-
aged. A full house would have given
us a majority, the majority against
us was not one of the whole house

13. One lesson we ought to learn
very thoroughly and that is if we
want temperance legislation we must
see to it, irrespective of our political
shibboleths, that we send temperan-
ce legislators to do our legislating.

14. Another is a need for a thor-
ough organization of the whole coun-
try to bring out the full vote in favor
of prohibition. The last vote in
favor of prohibition gave a large
majority in its favor and there is
little doubt that a large majority
will be given in its favor again, es-
pecially now since women have an
equal vote with the men.

15. The announcement was made
on May 7, officially by the premier,
that the referendum on the prohibi-
tory law of this morning would be
taken some time early in July. He
also announced that the questions
to be submitted had been prepared,
but would not be disclosed until the
date for the vote had been fixed.
We have every reason to believe
the questions will be satisfactory.

Secretary's Report

16. It is now our duty to see that
a thorough organization of the whole
province is made so that in every
polling place we have satisfactory
arrangements made to bring out the
full temperance vote. Considerable
progress has been made in this di-
rection as will be seen from the fol-
lowing report of the secretary. The
report is in part as follows: "To the
Members of Sub-Executive:

"I began work in July, 1919. The
work has been the education and
organization in the interests of pro-
hibition of the liquor traffic in this
province, the purpose being to organ-
ize every polling district previous
to the referendum vote."

Meetings have been held as fol-
lows and in nearly all cases organi-
zation has been completed:

Sunbury county includes Minto
(Northfield), Magerville, Blackville
Corner (Sheffield), Russlagornis
(Lincoln), Oromoco and Geary
(Barton), Patterson Settlement
(Blissfield), and Fredericton Jun-
ction, Gladstone.

York county —Devon, Kinsley,
Nashwaakia, Fredericton, Penniac,
Merrysville, and other points pre-
viously organized.

Queens County—Chipman and
Newcastle Bridge.

Charlotte county—Every parish is
organized, including St. James, St.
George, St. Patrick, Clarendon, Penn
field and Lepreau.

Kings County—Hatfield Point,
Beulah, Springfield, Boileau Creek,
Sussex, Hampton Village, Midland
and Bloomfield.

Albert County—Hillboro, Albert
Mines, Curryville, Hopewell Cape,
Hopewell Hill, Albert, Waterside,
Harvey, Alma provided for.

Westmorland County—Moncton
provided for, Sunny Brae, Point de
Bute, Dorchester, Sackville provided
for, Port Elgin, Balfield, Salisbury,
Petitodisco.

Kent county—Buctouche, McPee's
Mills, Coats Mills.

Northumberland County—Rogers-
ville, Chelmsford, Nelson, Upper
Derby, Lower Derby, Newcastle,
Millerton, Chatham, Blackville;
Boileston, Douglastown, Loggieville,
Redbank, Black River provided for.

Auxiliary associations are establish-
ed at Newcastle, Fredericton, Sussex
besides various temperance orders
affiliated with the alliance.

In almost every county in the
province there is an original branch of
the New Brunswick Temperance Al-
liance."

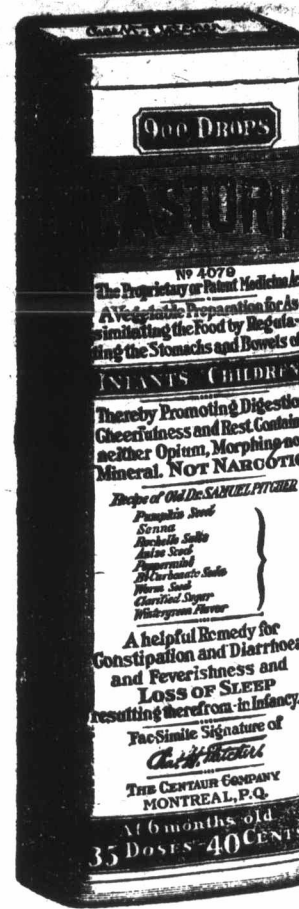
Since that meeting the following
places have been organized:

Wentford, Penobscia, James,
Gagetown, Westfield, Norton, Japo-
haqui, St. Martins.

Conferences are being arranged
for in St. John, Sussex, Moncton,
Sackville, Newcastle, Chatham, Bar-
bour, Campbellton, Westcoast,
Fredericton, Perth and Andover,
Edmundston, St. Stephen.

17.—In spite of all the unsatis-
factory conditions in regard to the
enforcement of the prohibitory law
such great advantages have accrued
to the country as to have proved its
great value and to make it worth
while in the best interests of the
country to retain it, and once the
law preventing importation is carried
and which is sure to come at no
distant date, the advantages of our
provincial law will become apparent
to every observer.

18.—In view of the seriousness of
the situation and the important re-
sults dependent on a large majority
vote, the challenge comes to our best
citizenship to do everything possible
to ensure success. What is now
needed is an united and energetic
province-wide effort by those who
believe in prohibition to ensure the
bringing about of a crowning victory
