CITY PARK INCLUDES PRIVATE PROPERTY

Nearly Three Acres of Private Property Said to Be Enclosed Within City Park Fences—Owners Offer to Sell to City.

(From Monday's Daily)
That owing to an increased survey having been made nearly three acres of land, the property of Messrs. Baroch and Bissell, are enclosed within the City Park, is the statement made by Messrs. Boyle and Arlow, in a communication addressed to the commissioners Saturday. Messrs. Baroch and Bissell are the owners of Virginia Park, adjoining the City Park on the south. If their statements are correct Pine Avenue, along which the new street car line to the Highlands will run, in its location within city property. On behalf of their clients, Messrs. Boyle and Arlow offer, in a communication to the commissioners, to sell to the city the property enclosed within the park fences for \$100. A decision on this offer will be reached by the commissioners at a meeting to be held on Saturday next. Messrs. Boyle and Arlow, and Messrs. Driscoll and Kuchel, surveyors, to whom the plans were referred.
