Famous Bandit Leaves Fortune to Son of Victim.

New York, April 15.-Mr. John Frillman of Oil City, Pa., who was in New York yesterday, had an unusual tale to tell of a legacy. He said he was en route to Danvers, Mass., to deliver a sum of money to a man there whose name he preferred to keep a ecret. This money, he said, was left the Danvers man, when he was a boy by Jesse James, the outlaw.

"Years ago," said Frillman, "Orral Smith, of Allegheny, Pa., lived at a hotel in Omaha, which was frequented by Jesse James and his friends. He and James became close friends. One day James gave Smith a 45calibre revolver. He said there was a note in the hollow place in the handle, but that Smith must not open the gun's stock until April 9, 1911. He gave Smith to understand that he (James) wanted to provide for a boy, and told him he had deposited some money in a bank in Kansas to remain there until the boy grew up. He feared he would not live to see the boy attain manhood, so he intrusted Smith with the instructions.

Had Grown to Manhood.

"Last Sunday, being April 9, 1911, Smith opened the gun and found the instructions. He followed them and located the boy, now a grown man, in Danvers, Mass. He deputized me to go to Danvers and tell the boy of his good fortune, and I'm on my way now. I believe the boy was the son of a man James had killed.

"The Danvers man," concluded Frillman, "is married and has three children. The money, including principal and interest, now amounts to \$15,000. I don't know why James was so interested in the boy, unless it was sentiments connected with the death of the lad's father."
