Premier Lloyd George speaking at the Lord Mayor's banquet to-night, reerring to the Supreme Council's at empt at Russia's Peace early this rear, said, "I hope the time is not listant when the powers will be able o renew that attempt with better prospects of success." The Premier ecounted briefly the world's troubles saying apart from Russia, the outlook s good. He spoke optimistically of the Adriatic and Turkish questions which with Russia he said constituted the world's chief problems. He recalled that exactly a year ago at the same Board, he announced the abdication of the German Emperor. He said the Adriatic question has gathered about it a deep passion, but I am confident a settlement will be found comnatible with the interest and honor of our gallant Allies.
