Repugnant to Exhum **But Court Orders It**

INSURANCE COMPANY TO HAVE BODY EXAMINED AS TO CAUSE OF DEATH.

When the motion, asking for an order for the exhumation of the remains of the late William Lyon, again came before Mr. Justice Mowat in weekly court at Osgoode, Hall to-day, his lordship said: "I said that I was averse to making such an order and you start with that handleap. It is repugnant to all human nature to dig up a human body; and I shall not make the order unless there are very strong circumstances to warrant such

The application for the order was made by the Ocean Accident and Guarantee Company, and defended by Annie MacArthur, the beneficiary under the policy, and Mary Wallace, the administratrix of the estate.

"Have you got the affidavits of the first grave digger and the second grave digger?" demanded Mr. Justice Mowat. "Alas! poor Torick can give no evidence for himself."

It was contended by counsel for the

company, that a policy of \$30,000 upon which claim for double liability was made, was issued on the late William Lyon, when he was suffering from a complication of diseases; consisting of tuberculosis of the lungs, diabetes, Bright's disease and other kidney disease, defective eyesight and other troubles . Claim was made by Annie MacArthur, the beneficiary, under the policy, that his death was due to septicemia which originated from a cut on his hand. The question to be answered by the autopsy was regarding the state of health of the deceased at the time the policy was issued and at the time of its last renewal. It was stated that an action had been started in the supreme court for a declaration that the policy was null and void because of misrepresentation at the time

of its having been granted. The costs of funerals engaged the attention of the court for a short digression. "The whole matter of sepulture has gone wrong," declared his lordship. "They seal dead bodies in lead and copper caskets-hermetically sealed-instead of putting them in pine coffins. It is no longer a case of dust to dust, as it should be."

It was stated that the average funeral cost about \$100. "Oh, I can't believe that," interjected the bench "Most families would consider themselves disgraced if they only had to pay \$100 for a funeral."

peculiar diseases known to medical science was under observation of the Chicago Medical Society to-day. The sufferer was a 55-year-old woman. The disease, known as hermochromatosis, causes the patient's skin to turn a brownish color and become extremely hard and leathery. It is so rare that medical science knows very little about it.

In all cases in women heretoforewhich is only four—the disease has not been discovered until after death. But the Chicago patient seems to be defying precedents and is in a fair way to recover, her physician, Dr. James H. Hutton, says,

"Her skin during the last 21 months

has become considerably softer. She has gotten over the diabetic condition accompanying the disease and is feeling fine. It seems as if she is going to get well," the doctor says.

Dr. Hutton said the first indication of the disease was a perpetual coldness about the body. The patient is

More than that, the inventor predicted that the rays of the rising sun would be able to turn on the heat in the furnace of the future household. The sun's light, acting on a Zworykin tube, he said, would also be able to shut the bedroom windows and start the coffee percolator in the kitchen while late risers were still asleep.

Mr. Zworykin explained that his invention. while it had vast potentialities, was still in a crude state. It must be studied and perfected, a process which might take several years, before it could be practicable for gen-eral use, he said. Already it has been bought by a cigar manufacturer to sort varying qualities of cigars by means of its marvelous sensitiveness to color. The instrument was so sen-sitive, Mr. Zworykin said, that it could be made to react to right differences of one wave length.

The Simpson-Roosevelt Field Muse um Expedition, comprised of Theodore and Kermit Roosevelt, sons of the late President Roosevelt, Mr. George Cherrie, of the National Natural History Museum of America, and another, have returned to Srinagar from their tour in search of specimens of rare plants and animals in Turkestan.
