DECLINES OFFER OF AUSTRALIAN ARCHBISHOPRIC

Rev. Dr. H. J. Cody Tells His Congregation He Will Stay With Them.

TORONTO, April 24.—Rev. Dr. H. J. Cody, rector of St. Paul's Church, this city, announced to his parishioners this morning that he had decided not to accept the call to the archbishopric of Melbourne, Australia, but to stay with his people at St. Paul's. This announcement was received with applause, and the congregation rose and sang the Doxology.

Rev. Dr. Cody expressed appreciation of the importance of the position of Archbishop of Melbourne and the opportunities of service it offered in matters spiritual, ecclesiastical, educational, missionary and imperial, and he thanked his fellow clergymen of Australia for their confidence in him. But he said he felt that his present duty lay in Canada. "I am 52," continued Dr. Cody, "I have breathed the spirit of Canada since infancy, and the attachment arose whether I could be wisely transplanted into a country of different climate and other conditions."

Deeply Affected.
The strength of the parochial ties which bound him to Toronto was touched upon by Dr. Cody, who mentioned that he had gone to St. Paul's 29 years ago to assist in reading the Gospels.

NO FAVORITISM, SAYS CODY, IN WESTERN GRANT

Chairman of Royal Commission Explains Western University's Unique Position.

BUILDINGS NEEDED
Points Out That Grant Will Have To Be Supplemented

TORONTO, April 24.—The Toronto Star on Saturday carried the following interesting account of an interview with Archdeacon Cody, in which he shows that the grant of \$800,000 to the Western University at the present time is fully justified by the unique situation which prevails in London. The Star says:

"No favoritism has been shown by the Government towards Western University by reason of the fact that that institution will receive \$800,000 for buildings, the full amount recommended by the royal commission on university finances, whereas considerable slices were made in the recommendations for Toronto and Queen's Universities. This was the opinion expressed by Archdeacon Cody, who was chairman of the royal commission, in commenting on the announcement of Hon. R. H. Grant, minister of education, that the full grant of \$800,000, as recommended, would be paid to the university at London."

"The Western is in a different position with respect to buildings from both Varsity and Queen's," Dr. Cody explained. "The commission's recommendation for Western was the minimum necessary to go on with, whereas the other two institutions can jog along, very conveniently, it is true, but still they can carry on under a postponement of their building program."

Absolutely Necessary.
"What the Government has apparently done has been done because of absolute necessity," Dr. Cody added, "and I think it was very desirable. They have a unique situation at London. There they have improvised old buildings, and unless they got the grant of \$800,000 they would be unable to stop right where they were. Even with the Government grant they will have to raise another \$300,000 locally to provide for a gymnasium, approaches to the grounds and other improvements and additions."

The royal commission's recommendation for the institution at London was a total grant of \$1,000,000, of which \$200,000 was for maintenance and \$800,000 for new buildings. Dr. Cody said the university there had bought a large tract of land for extensions. The university itself must also secure the funds to cover cost of all other extensions than those recommended by the commission.

Toronto Next Year.
Hon. R. H. Grant announced in the House a few days ago that for the session ending June, 1922, the University of Toronto would be allocated \$1,800,000. This is \$900,000 in excess of the amount granted for the current session, and will provide for the erection of the \$900,000 anatomical building. But the remainder, \$1,380,000, will not be in any way for maintenance charges, and will not permit of any allowance for further building extensions. The royal commission recommended that Varsity should receive \$4,500,000 for its building program.

Queen's University at Kingston, Mr. Grant announced at the same time, will receive \$325,000, as compared with the commission's recommendation of \$615,000, of which \$340,000 was to be for new buildings.

Mr. T. A. Russell, who was a member of the royal commission, expressed the same opinion as Dr. Cody. "With this or nothing," he said, "Unlike the other institutions, a grant of part of the recommendation would be of no use. I also do not think there has been any undue discrimination on the part of the Government towards Western University."

GOVERNMENT HAS GRANTED \$200,000 FOR MAINTENANCE

The Provincial Government has voted the sum of \$200,000 in the supplementary estimates as a maintenance grant for the Western University during the current fiscal year.

This will help the university very materially, and will enable it for the time being to proceed with its work unhampered.

In order to provide much-needed expansion until the building program of the Western is in operation, the arts department will take possession of the old Medical School at the corner of Waterloo and York streets, which is now being vacated, and will carry on the work there with this in view.

As announced to The Advertiser in an interview on Saturday, the minister of education has given the assurance that a grant sufficient to cover the necessities of the university extension scheme will be forthcoming in due time, and Dr. Grant has promised to make an official statement regarding the Government's intention to do so to assist the Western in carrying out its building program. This announcement will be made in a few days.

GETTING REAL OLD.

Twelve-Hour Battle Between Republicans and Military Police

Casualties Amongst Government Forces Were Few—Rebels Scatter Into Hills When Reinforcements Threaten To Envelop Them—Two Brothers Murdered in Reprisal.

DUBLIN, April 24.—Fighting which lasted for twelve hours is reported from the neighborhood of Maam Cross, County Galway. Fourteen policemen, under command of a district inspector, went at 4 o'clock this morning in search of a republican flying column. The rebels were found entrenched on a high ground in the vicinity of the home of Patrick O'Malley, member of the Parliament. The police took to cover as best they could, and a prolonged engagement ensued, in which a sergeant was killed and a sergeant wounded. At 3:30 this afternoon reinforcements for the police arrived, bringing with them machine-guns. They enveloped the position of the rebels, who fled to the hills, taking their weapons with them.

According to an official statement issued from Dublin Castle, Father Cunningham Lennane, who motored out to the scene of the fighting to administer the rights of the church to the wounded, was deliberately fired upon by the rebels, but escaped injury.

Burned Two Houses.
In the vicinity of the fighting the police say they found arms and ammunition, beds for 40 persons and the stock and collar of a pig, which, they said, had been used by the leader of the rebels as a disguise.

A search of two neighboring houses showed that they had been used as ambushes. These were burned to the ground by the police.

Simultaneous raids by republicans on 22 policemen in Cork resulted in the capture of 47 registered and 739 ordinary letters.

Bombs Thrown.
Two constables were wounded Saturday night by bombs thrown from upper windows in a public house in Limerick. One civilian was hit by splinters of a bomb.

Last night a large number of bombs and a quantity of ammunition were found in stables near Wellington road, a high-class residential quarter in Dublin.

Four police barracks were attacked Saturday night—in the Dublin, Armagh and Queenstown. At Ardee the barracks were successfully defended, but that in Queenstown was destroyed, and was, was completely destroyed.

TWO BROTHERS KILLED.
BELFAST, April 24.—Two brothers, Patrick and Daniel Duffin, respectively, were shot and killed at midnight Saturday. It is believed they were shot in reprisal for an attack on the barracks in Queenstown, when Cadet Bolin was killed and Cadet Biles wounded. Two civilians, Mrs. Louise Gilson and Thomas Kennedy, also received wounds in the early attack.

A long-haired yellow dog found in the kitchen of the cottage where the two young Irishmen were killed, is regarded as a clue to the identity of the man who shot them. According to John Duffin, a brother of the dead men, the dog was taken away from the cottage by a district constable of the Royal Irish Constabulary, who visited the place at 6 o'clock this morning with a party of police to investigate the tragedy.

Cadets Bolin and Biles were attacked in a crowded thoroughfare. They were shot by the first auxiliaries to make their appearance in Belfast. They came from Sligo several days ago and intended to return Saturday night. They had
