World Canada Fall a Ready Prey to the Ambition in the Event of War?

THE BRITISH SEA TROUBLE.

London, July 8.—That important instructions have been sent to the British naval squadrons in the Pacific is a matter of well-authenticated report, but the nature of the instructions cannot definitely be ascertained. It is known that the flagship *Warrior* is now en route to Bismarck, and that a formidable array of naval forces will be gathered there to defend vessels sailing under the English flag against American attack. How far the English may be prepared to go is not stated; but any American cruiser conveying prizes to San Francisco will be very likely to encounter English ships of war on the voyage and probably seek for explanation.

It is known that the American naval force in the Pacific is considerably smaller than the British squadron, and that the English will have no difficulty in asserting England's rights, as they are called in those waters. A hostile encounter between British and American ships would not necessarily involve war, but would certainly tend to provoke it. In this connection, Gen. Lord, Commander of the British army, director of military intelligence and brother of the late eminent Major-General Brackenbury, is quoted as commenting on the recent assertion of some American writers that Canada would fall a ready prey in the event of war.

Gen. Lord says, "Four years to conquer the States of the South, and with every advantage in the way of climate and knowledge of the country invaded as well as the great and powerful advantage of the presence of several millions of the native population in sympathy with the invader, and from whom many valuable recruits were obtained for the Northern army. The United States would find the invasion and conquest of Canada a more formidable task. Winter campaigning, which was far from difficult in the Northern States, would be impossible there, and an army caught in winter would either be humiliated in with ignominious retreat, or, if it succeeded in conquering the country, it would be a mere waste of money and blood."

THE AMERICAN TARIFF BILL.

The aggressive action in regard to the tariff is now complicated in popular opinion here with the rising indignation on the subject of the American tariff. Thousands of skilled English workmen will be thrown out of employment if the tariff is adopted. In Sheffield, alone, from 2,000 to 2,500 persons are employed solely upon American work. Many of these men are regarded as the best in the world, and their loss would be a serious blow to the American tariff. The tariff is now being discussed in the House of Commons, and it is expected that it will be passed in the near future.

THE HYDE PARK DEMONSTRATION.

Chief of Police Bradford made extraordinary preparations to-day to prevent any demonstration in Hyde Park. The police were ordered to be on the alert, and to be ready to take any necessary action.

THE PRISONERS' ASSOCIATION.
