STILL SEEING THINGS

Americans Endeavor to Locate Japanese Who Supposed to Spy on Fleet

Lisbon, Feb. 1.—King Carlos, of Portugal and the Crown Prince, Luiz, were assassinated today, and the city is in a state of uproar. The King's second son, the Infant Manuel, was slightly wounded, but Crown Prince Luiz, who strove to save the King, was severely injured.

A band of men waiting at the corner of the Praco do Commercio and Rua do Comercio suddenly sprang toward the open carriage, in which the royal family were driving to the palace and leveling carbines, which they fired at the King and Crown Prince. The King and Crown Prince were each shot three times, and they lived only long enough to be carried to the marine arsenal, nearby, where they expired.

Almost at the first shot the King fell back on the cushions dying, and at the same moment the Crown Prince was seen to fall, and then sink back on the seat. Queen Amelie jumped up and threw herself toward the Crown Prince in an apparent effort to save his life at the cost of her own, but the Prince already had received his death wound. The police guard fired upon the assassins and killed two of them.

The royal family were returning from Vila Vicosa, where they had been sojourning, and were on their way from the railroad station to the palace. A strong guard was in attendance, reported to be composed of the regulars of the royal carriage. It seemed as though a number of shots were fired, and all in an instant, and before the startled onlookers could move the man had turned and was madly fighting his way through the crowd in an endeavor to reach open space and make his escape.

It is believed that one of the dead was a Spaniard and another a Frenchman. The weapons they used were repeating carbines of five-chambered. Meanwhile an unhappy scene was in progress at the royal carriage, where King Carlos lay dead, the Crown Prince unconscious and breathing his last, and the Infant Manuel, who was bleeding from his mouth, leaning over the bodies of his father and dying brother.

The queen, who had miraculously escaped unhurt from the veritable rain of bullets, had knelt beside her husband and son. The excitement in the vicinity of the tragedy threatened to become serious, and the soldiers quickly surrounded the carriage, which was driven to the square surrounding the royal arsenal, however, the town hall and the Bank of Portugal are occupied by troops.

Queen Maria Pia, the mother of King Carlos; the Duke of Oporto, his brother; a number of the ministers of the royal government, hastened to the arsenal, where the news reached them of the attack upon the royal family. Queen to be Regent.

Among the first to be called into the arsenal was Premier Franco, the dictator of the kingdom. Franco was preceded by a squadron of cavalrymen who were ordered to clear the square of the crowd. The discovery of the plot as well as the discovery of many secret stores of weapons and ammunition had demonstrated beyond doubt the existence of a large body of the Portuguese to overthrow the present conditions and proclaim a republic.

The tragedy occurred about 5:30 in the afternoon, but the panic was instantly gripped the city and all its activities, prostrated the lives of communication, and it was not for some hours that the news of the assassination was permitted to be sent broadcast. Lisbon wears an air of utter desolation. The theatres and cafes are closed and the streets are almost deserted. The electric cars are moving without passengers. In short, the city has shut itself up in the houses.
