A network extending across the Pacific Ocean to New Zealand, from there to Vancouver Island, across to Vancouver City; then the land line of the Canadian Pacific Railway would be used across the continent to some point such as Graspe, from where a cable would be laid to Great Britain, the whole length being estimated at about 15,000 miles, 11,135 of which would be submarine cable. 
