Another school term is nearly over, and so swiftly have the busy weeks sped by that we cannot realize we are soon to enter upon the seventh and last month of this session.

The attendance has been very good, the average up to date being 66, one higher than last year. More than 100 applications were received, and about 80 of these accepted. Of this number we have admitted 76, 4 we were obliged to send away, and 3 have left owing to illness. 30 of the 76 are of Roman Catholic parentage, but were, in some cases, either Protestants, or favorably inclined to Protestantism when they came to the Institute.
