Wood, Accountant; and the Balance Sheet of Accounts, certified in terms of the Act of Parliament; with other statements of the Affairs, as at 15th of Aprillast, the date of balance.

Nowithstanding the general depression of commercial affairs, the progress of the Association during the past year has been greater than in any other year, with only one exception. The Applications for New
