ONTARIO ARTILLERY ASSOCIATION.

Proposed Alterations in Constitution.

In conformity with Section 3 of the Constitution of the Ontario Artillery Association, notice to members thereof is hereby given that I am in receipt of a notice of motion that it is interded to propose the following changes in the Constitution at the General Meeting to be held at Toronto on the 5th February, 1889.

"That all the words in Section 5 from 'and shall be entitled' to the end of the section be omitted, and that 'the affiliation fees of batteries must be

paid on or before the 1st June of each year, to entitle to participation in any prizes offered by the Association, be added in lieu thereof."

"That all the words in Section 5 from and shall be entitled to the end of the Section be omitted, and that the affiliation fees of Batteries must be raid on the section of section be only before the 1st June 1 section be 1st June 1 section

and that 'the affiliation fees of Batteries must be paid on or before the 1st June of each year, to entitle participation in any prize offered by the Association' be added in lieu thereof.

"That the last clause of Section 9 be amended so as to read 'The President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be exofficio members of the Committee.'"

And "That Section 25 be amended so as to read 'that officers of the Association, and members of the Committee, not being life members, must pay the Committee, not being life members, must pay the annual subscription to remain as such."
