

commodities such as agricultural products (wheat, livestock, genetic materials), minerals (potash, coal, sulphur) and forest products (pulp, newsprint and fine paper). Total Canadian exports to Latin America and the Caribbean exceeded \$2.5 billion in 1989.

It is expected that, as regional economic circumstances improve, Canadian exporters will be able to expand their market share of regional imports, building on the excellent base established to date.
