What does Tron Power do? Tron Power Inc. got its start in 1985, when a small group of tradespeople and engineers partnered together and combined their many years of industrial construction experience with superior customer service. In 1997, the English River First Nation of Patuanak, Saskatchewan purchased the company. Tron Power serves the mining, forestry and oil and gas sectors. Customers include Crown corporations and international companies.

Joint ventures enabled Tron to partner with the largest providers of underground development and mining services in Canada. The Mudjatik-Thyssen Mining Joint Ventures consists of three separate joint ventures, all in northern Saskatchewan. Fifty percent ownership is split between Tron and seven First Nation and Métis communities. The other 50 percent is held by Thyssen Mining Construction of Canada.

Future goals include the provision of a wide range of top-quality services to Crown corporations, domestic and international industrial and mining projects, and to the oil and gas industry.

What is Tron Power's experience in exporting? Tron continues to work at the Kumtor gold mine in Kyrgyzstan, Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS). Also in the CIS, Tron refurbished a gold mine for International Gold Pool in Kazakhstan. Tron hopes to expand its international presence through its upcoming Tron/Casa Gari Joint Venture. Tron/Casa Gari's ownership will be shared equally between Tron and Casa Gari. Casa Gari is owned by the Garifuna people, an indigenous Honduran group who shares Tron's objectives of economic commercial development for their people. The company will pursue Hurricane Mitch reconstruction and other construction opportunities in Central America.
