## AGREEMENT WITH CITY OF OTTAWA

Hon. J. H. KING (Kootenay, Minister of Public Works) moved the second reading of Bill No. 172, to authorize an agreement between His Majesty the King and the corporation of the city of Ottawa.

Motion agreed to, bill read the second time, and the House went into committee thereon, Mr. Gordon in the chair.

On section 1—Agreement with city of Ottawa extended for five years.

Mr. STEVENS: I think we should have a brief statement from the minister regarding the agreement with the city.

Mr. KING (Kootenay): The bill provides that the government of Canada may pay a subsidy to the city of Ottawa. Agreements have been made from time to time, the last one having been entered into in 1920. At that time parliament voted for the payment of \$75,000 annually for five years, but in 1924-25 the agreement was not renewed; payment for one year was however extended. Recently in consultation with the municipality we have decided to increase the subsidy to \$100,000 for a period of five years.

Mr. CALDWELL: What sums does the government pay to the city of Ottawa?

Mr. KING (Kootenay): That information is all in Hansard at page 3758.
