That ends the quotation from Mr. Churchill but I should just like to say one word on what Mr. Churchill said. The Prime Minister of Britain expressed a deep faith and that faith was vindicated to the full by event after event during world war II. The people of Britain were made aware of their danger. They were made aware of the great cause for which they were struggling, of the over-arching Divine Providence and protection for their cause, and the righteousness of their cause. They did not hesitate to decide what they were willing to do.

At the appropriate moment, given statesmanship and leadership, the people of the free countries in the world, I am satisfied, would not hesitate to decide the part they would play and what sacrifices they would be prepared to make if they were made aware of the dangers to their freedom and liberty, and if they could be assured that our cause was just and right.
