neceffarily led into fome Obfervations upon the Law relative to overt Acts, and to what I have already faid, with the Permiffion of the Court, I will add, that, as the Statute of Treafon, contemplates the King's civil, as well, as natural Death, all Confpiracies, all Mealures to depote him, and every Act tending to fubject his Dominions to a foreign Power, are overt Acts of compaffing this Death. This is a broad Bafe for the Support of the first Count in the prefent Indictment. The Foundation of the fecond Count is equally extensive; for, every Attempt whateven to aid or allift the King's Enemies in the Profecution of a War against him, whether inccelsful or otherwife, is an overt Act of Adherence, thefe are Principles which, I must humbly hope, the: Court will fanction and confirm.

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Gentlemen, 1 truft we shall lay before you clear and full Proof of all the overt Acts charged in the Indictment, yet permit me to remark to you what has been often ruled that if one of themonly is established by two Witnesses, or two of them by one Witnesse to each, whole Testimony you believe, the Evidence will be fufficient. The Priloner will not then be entitled to the Pretumption of Innocence. The Crime of High Treaton will stand proved against him, and your Verdict, on the Oath you have taken, according to the Duty you owe to God, TO YOUR SOVERSIGN, YOUR COUNTRY AND YOURSELVES mult be, that He is GUILTY in Manner and Form as He stands indicted.

## EVIDENCE FOR THE CROWN.

## MR. WILLIAM BARNARD (fworn).

Attorney General: Do you know the Prifoner? Witnefs: 1 do.

AW: Gen. How long have you known him? Witnefs. Since July 1796.

Atty. Gen. Where did you first fee him?

Witnefs. In the State of Vermont, but near the Province Line. Atty. Gen. Had you any conversation with him? Witnefs. I had a good Deal.

Atty: Gen. Pray give an Account of it?

MR. PYKE. If your Honors will permit us, We object to this Evidence. The overt Acts are all laid to have been committed in the Parish of Quebec, and they offer Evidence of Conversation which passed in Vermont.
