To mark the spot where the deceased Prelate had been laid to rest, a mural tablet was placed in St. Andrew's church, and upon it a Latin inscription of which the following is a translation:

## " D. O. M.

"Here lies, in the hope of a blessed immortality, Æneas B, Mac-Eachern, first Bishop of Charlottetown. Adorned with all the virtues that should distinguish a Bishop, he labored with unwearied zeal to promote the glory of God and to forward the spiritual interests of his neighbor. His death brought great and lasting grief to all good men, and to none more than the poor, for whose sake he himself had passed his life in poverty.

"He died on the 22nd of April, 1835, in the seventy-sixth year of his age, and in the fourteenth of his episcopate 1."
