

The general objections are,

That it has not an assembly.

That it takes away the trial by juries  
in civil cases,

That it is a free toleration of the ca-  
tholic religion.

That the jurisdiction will extend over  
other colonies.

That it will prejudice our fishery.

That it is establishing an arbitrary go-  
vernment, instead of giving one on  
the principles of our constitution.

To consider whether the government  
intended to be given them is suitable to  
the genius of the people, we must take  
a view of the inhabitants, their customs,  
manners, and dispositions; and from a  
mature consideration of those, deduce  
the principles we mean to establish the  
government upon.

The
