BY-LAWS.**BY-LAW No. 837.**

A By-Law to Provide for the Deepening of a
Part of the River Beaudette, in the Town-
ships of Charlottentown and Lancaster,
and for Borrowing on the Credit of the
Municipality the sum of \$7,700.00 for Com-
pleting the same.

Provisionally adopted the 18th day of Octo-
ber, 1888.

Whereas the River Beaudette runs through
the Townships of Charlottentown and Lan-
caster, in the County of Glengarry, one of the
United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and
Glengarry, and the Municipal Council of the
Township of Charlottentown has made an
application to the Municipal Council of the
United Counties of Stormont, Dundas and
Glengarry, to deepen the said River through
the said Townships of Charlottentown and
Lancaster, and remove obstructions therefrom
for the purpose of draining the lands in the
vicinity of the said River and in the vicinity
of the lands between Lot number twenty-
seven in the eighth Concession of the said
Township of Charlottentown, to Lot number
one in the said eighth Concession of said
Township of Charlottentown, both inclusive,
and also Lot number nineteen in the seventh
Concession of the said Township of Lancaster
to Lot number thirty-eight in the said seventh
Concession of said Township of Lancaster.

And whereas, thereupon the said Council
procured an examination to be made by
David R. Brown, a Provincial Land Surveyor,
being a person competent for such purpose, of
the said River proposed to be deepened, and
has also procured plans and estimates of the
work to be made by the said David R. Brown
and an assessment to be made by him of the
real property to be benefitted by such deepening;
stating as nearly as he can the proportion
of benefit which in his opinion will be derived
in consequence of such drainage and deepening
by every road and lot or portion of lot,
the said assessment so made and the report of
the said David R. Brown in respect thereof,
and of the said deepening, being as follows:

To D. A. McArthur, Esq., Chairman of the
River Beaudette Drainage Committee.

SIR,—In accordance with your instructions
I have made a survey, plan, profile, estimate
and assessment for the improvement of the
channel of part of River Beaudette, in order
to drain the low lands in the vicinity of said
River.

I find that the work should commence at
stake No. 0, planted on the North bank of said
River at the centre line of Lot 27 in the 8th
Concession, Township of Charlottentown,
near the centre of said 8th Concession and
east of Monroe's mills, at a depth of 6 feet be-
low a hub at the foot of said stake No. 0, or 4.35
feet below a B. M. on an ash tree about 60 feet
westerly of said stake 0 near the north bank
of the River. Thence following the River
easterly to stake No. 24, with a fall of .04 feet
per 100. Thence easterly following the old
channel to stake 813, with a fall of .01 feet per
100. Thence to stake 918, with a fall of .02 feet
per 100. Thence to stake 1048 x 30, with a fall

of .05 feet per 100; said stake, 1048 x 30, is 194
feet below McLennan's mill dam, on Lot No.
19, 7th Concession, Lancaster, a distance of
nearly 20 miles.

The channel should be 8 feet wide in the
bottom, with a slope on each side of 1½ feet
horizontally, to 7 feet in depth.

If the above is properly carried out I believe
it will redeem the drowned lands along the
River and provide a proper outlet for the
drainage of the swamp lands in the vicinity
of the said River.

Where the banks of the River are high the
earth and stones may be deposited in the bogs
so as not to obstruct the channel, as may be
directed by the person in charge of the work.

In the low lands the earth should be re-
moved to at least six feet from the banks of
the River and spread. The stones to be placed
in the bogs out of the way of the channel, if
the owners of the property do not choose to
remove them.

All of said work to be done to the satisfac-
tion of the Engineer in charge.

And whereas the said Council are of the
opinion that the deepening of the said River
between said lots is desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Muni-
cipal Council of the United Counties of Stormont,
Dundas and Glengarry, pursuant to the
provisions of the Consolidated Municipal Act,
1883,

1st. That the said report, plans and estimates
be adopted, and the said deepening and the
works connected therewith be made and con-
structed in accordance therewith.

2nd. That the Warden of the said Municipal
Council may borrow on the credit of the Cor-
poration of the United Counties of Stormont,
Dundas and Glengarry the sum of \$7,700, being
the funds necessary for the work, and may
issue debentures of the Corporation to that
amount in sums of not less than one hundred
dollars each and payable within ten years
from the date thereof, with interest at the
rate of five per centum per annum, to be paid
in ten annual consecutive instalments, to be
of such amounts that the aggregate amount
payable for principal and interest in any year
shall be equal (as nearly as may be) to what
is payable for principal and interest during
each of the other years of such period of ten
years, and make such debentures payable at
the branch of the Bank of Montreal in the
Town of Cornwall.

3rd. That for the purpose of paying the sum
of \$6,973.73, being the amount charged against
the said lands so benefitted as aforesaid other
than the roads belonging to the several Muni-
cipalities, and to cover interest thereon for
ten years at the rate of five per centum per
annum, the following special rate over and
above all other rates shall be assessed and
