May the Almighty grant that his case may be yours, and that every person who now hears me, may one day be able to rejoice in the Divine love! And thus living to the glory of God on earth, may finally be translated to that Blessed place, where love shall receive its fullest recompense, even the salvation of our immortal souls!
