The following items re Canadian cattle prices were taken from The Chicago Live. Stock World of June 9.
Cheap Canadian cattle are a myth. Exporters are buying freely on the Chicago market this week, because the easy picking they anticipated in Toronto at this stage has not materialized. Morris paid \$60.5 for export steers at the Canadian market on Monday, while the Keefer purchase here the next day was all made at a range of \$5.90 to \$3.15, and Chicago cornfed bullocks are superior to Outario product at any stage. Twenty-one loads of steers were bought at Toronto on Monday to go to Winnipeg, and another consignment was taken for Vancouver. This is the secret of why cattle are selling higher at Toronto than Chicago.

A lot of Chicago-bought export, cattle were fed in transit at Toronto this week. Considering superior quality of corn-fed stuff, they figured 20c lower than Toronto export purchases, which have been meagre this week. Wednesday's Toronto market showed a 25c advance in a week, \$6.20 being paid for a load of export cattle. Everything else was taken on local butcher account.
