MAY ANNUL MARRIAGE

Mistake and Won't Have Hubby.

An action was entered at Osgoode Hall yesterday on behalf of Ellen Maria Parr (nee Fasken), who seeks to have her clandestine marriage with Henry Parr annulled on the ground that it was entered into during the time both were minors and without consent of their parents.

Ellen and Henry were attending
Elora High School. Henry proposed
to buy Ellen a "meal ticket for life,"

and she consented, but now that she has left school Ellen finds that she really did not love Henry.

In seeking to annul the marriage following amendment to the Marriage Act, passed at the last session of the Dominion parliament, is invok-

"In case a form of marriage shall be gone thru between two persons, either of whom is under eighteen years without the consent required by section 15 of this act, the High Court of Justice shall have jurisdiction and power, notwithstanding that a license or certificate was granted and that the ceremony was performed by a person authorized by law to solemnize the marriage, in an action brought by either party who was at the tim the ceremony under the age of eighteen years, to declare and adjudge that a valid marriage was not effected or

The girl's case is being prosecuted by her father, a farmer of Wellington County, and in her affidavit she says: "I am not influenced in my decision by my parents or others, as I was told that I could not be happy without him I should go with him, but as soon as I realized what I had done I saw I had made a dreadful mistake. Under no circumstances will I ever have any-thing to do with him, and am most anxious that the marriage be declared not binding on me.'


