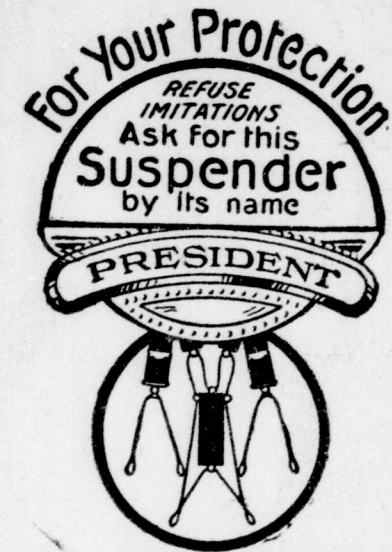


C. B. HILLIER WINS ELMWOOD TOURNEY FROM 21 RINKS
