STOP PURCHASE OF SECURITIES **OUTSIDE NATION**

Drayton Statement Says Canada Cannot Absorb Foreign Debt.

HERE MONEY NEEDED

Says Financing Crop Move and Other Business Requires Every Dollar.

TORONTO, Sept. 9.—On the authority of Sir Henry Drayton, minister of finance, who is tonight attending a demonstration in honor of the prime minister, Hon. Arthur Meighen, in Sir Henry's constituency, Kingston, Ont., the following statement has been issued regarding the financial situation in Canada.

"Owing to the financial conditions arising out of the war and the change in Canada in recent months from a lavorable trade balance to an adverse trade balance, the minister of finance has requested the Canadian banks to decline to facilitate the importation or carrying of Canadian and other securities which have been held abroad. To that end the minister is requesting the banks to have purchasers of sterling or foreign exchange in amounts of a thousand dollars or over and the banks to have purchasers of sterling or foreign exchange in amounts of a thousand dollars or over and drawees of drafts received for collection from outside of Canada for the like amounts, certify that the exchange so required, or the draft from abroad does not represent the purchase outside of Canada of such securities.

"The minister is of the opinion that it is impossible for Canada to absorb this portion of its foreign debt or foreign securities at this juncture without embarrassment to general financial conditions. Every available dollar now in Canada is required for the business of the country, and particularly to

of the country, and particularly to finance the crop movement, and if money is withdrawn in the way referred to, the withdrawal will seriously affect and restrict the commercial activities of the country."

RUSSIANS SHOW OPTIMISM, SAYS MOSCOW WORD

Polish Wireless To Paris Says Soviet Situation Brilliant.

PARIS, Sept. 2.—A Moscow wireless ommunication picked up today says:
"The Tolish Government is mistaken it has illusions that the military situation has undergone unfavorable changes, as owing to the reserves sent to the front, the military situation of Soviet Russia once more is brilliant. Soviet Russia once more is brilliant.

"We adhere, as ever, to the conditions of our ultimatum. We hope for a lasting peace, but owing to the incessant struggle of the Polish workmen for peace with Russia. We have the right to complete the Polish army with an armed workmen's militia without injuring the cause of peace.

"The Soviet Government hopes for the moral support and sympathy of the working classes of all countries.

"The British Government would oppose with the same vigor the formation." "The British Government would oppose with the same vigor the formation of an armed bourgeois militia.

"The Polish Government suddenly shows a great desire for peace, the foreign minister. Prince Sapieha, expressing the hope that the negotiations will be concluded at the earliest possible moment. The red army in several sectors has begun an offensive, and the Government of Poland understands that with the end of the Polish successes it is the most favorable moment to make peace.

"Poland had founded great hopes upon international politics as a weapon against Soviet Russia, but the American Government has affirmed in a positive manner its opposition to Polish

positive manner its opposition to Polish imperialism, advising Poland not to attempt the occupation of Russian territories. The stand of the American Government is what has inspired the Polish landlords in their desire to make peace."

RUSS DELEGATES WILL GO TO RIGA

Warsaw, Sept. 9 .- A Russian Boishewarsaw, Sept. S.—A Russian Bolsne-vik peace delegation will go to Riga to meet Polish representatives, Prince Sa-picha. Polish foreign minister, has been notified by George Tchitcherin, Russian Bolshevik minister of foreign affairs. The latter, however, did not mention the date when the Soviet representa-tives would leave Moscow.
