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There was a light run of calves and calves from 100 to 150 lbs., weighing from 100 to 150 lbs., they could have been bought for \$2 a lb. While there is no disposition to boost the western cattle at the expense of the Ontario end, the fact remains that the percentage of dressed meat is relatively higher in the former than in the latter.

The fact of the matter is, the Ontario farmer has on the whole been breeding to scrub bulls and developing an inferior class of butcher stock, and every day and experienced drover and commission man will tell you so. The outlook for the Ontario end of the game does not look very bright until the winter run is out of the road.

Run Will Be Short. At the same time the Ontario farmer, if he wants to get in on the feeder end of the game and get some cattle for his stable must act promptly as next Monday will be about his last chance to get in on the good feeders. These cattle are being sold well and the money and with good care will respond readily to the feed. Thrifty and young a large proportion of them will want to emphasize the need for quick action in the matter.

Hog Market. The hog market was very unsettled and fairly strong in spots. While the packer got off some of the threatened cut, they did not get it all off as yet, and the prices yesterday ranged from 12 3/4 to 15 1/2 c. F. O. B.

Sheep and Lambs. The lamb market was 50 c. wt. lower, choice black-heads selling at from 12 3/4 to 14 1/2 c. heavy, 12 1/2 to 14 c. yearlings, 12 to 13 c. choice handy yearlings and from 6 to 6 1/2 c. yearling sheep and from 4 to 4 1/2 c. The market was slow at the decline, but everything was well cleaned up.

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
