AGREEMENT made and entered into, in triplicate,
this 20th day of October, 1916,

Between THE SUPERINTENDENT GENERAL OF INDIAN
AFFAIRS,
And THE STANDARD CHEMICAL IRON & LUMBER COMPANY
OF CANADA, LIMITED,

WHEREAS the Parry Island Band of Indians have
consented to the taking out of five thousand cords of
hardwood from a specified portion of their reserve.

AND WHEREAS a satisfactory offer has been made
for the said cord wood by the said Standard Chemical Iron
& Lumber Company of Canada, Limited.

WITNESSETH, that the said Superintendent General
of Indian Affairs hereby grants permission to the said
Standard Chemical Iron & Lumber Company of Canada, Limited,
to obtain five thousand cords of hardwood, consisting only
of hard maple, beech, black and red birch, ironwood and
first growth oak, to be taken out on a section of the
land on Parry Island not over three square miles in area,
the location of which to be marked out under authority
from the Department of Indian Affairs.

It is, therefore, hereby agreed by and between
the parties hereto as follows:-

1. That the quantity of cordwood to be cut
shall not exceed five thousand cords of the kinds above
specified.
2. That the area to be cut over shall not
exceed three square miles, to be marked out as aforesaid.
3. That a royalty of fifty cents per cord shall
be paid and transmitted to the Department of Indian Affairs
