Gagetown, N. B., Sept. 8—A drowning accident occurred at the Cossar Farm, Lower Gagetown, on Tuesday evening, when a young Scotchman, William Dickson, was drowned, and a Scotch boy, who was with him, barely escaped the same fate. The two young men were crossing the river from the intervale to the farm in a cance, about 8 o'clock in the evening, when a sudden movement on the part of one of them overturned the cance. Neither could swim, and Dickson soon went down, but those who gathered at the spot were able to save his companion. Dickson was twenty-one years of age, and had worked in Sussex for a time. Not being for the summer. He was very favorably known by all with whom he had been associated. This is the first fatality which has occurred at the Cossar Farm, although it has been instituted for several years, and has had a large number of boys under its charge.

MORNING WAR SUMMARY

London, Sept. 9, 10 p. m.—The German Crown Prince is making another etermined attempt to break through the French lines in the Argonne, and, acording to the Berlin official statement, has succeeded in taking trenches over a front of two kilometres (one and one-quarter miles) and to a depth of from 300 to 500 metres, capturing 2,000 prisoners, 48 machine guns and 64 mine-throwers.

The French, both in their midnight report and again this afternoon, admit that the Germans had gained a partial success, but declare that in most instances they were thrown back with heavy losses.

This is the second effort of the German Emperor's heir to win a victory in
