

BRAZILIAN IS THE LEADER IN MONTREAL

Trading Reported Quiet at Opening of the Stock Market

FEW CATTLE SOLD
Prices Range Slightly Higher—Calf Receipts 1,639—Hog Increased

MONTREAL, June 22.—Trading was quiet at the opening of today's stock market, with Brazilian the least active issue. The price, however, remained the same at 67. Montreal Power came next at 188 1/2, off 1/2. Twin City was the strong spot with an advance of 2 to 68. The only other change was in Spanish River, which advanced 1/4 to 105. Atlantic Sugar, Canadian Converters and Shawinigan sold unchanged at 81 1/2, 88 1/2 and 182 respectively. A few shares of Detroit Railway changed hands at 8 1/2, up the fraction.

IN WALL STREET

NEW YORK, June 22.—Stock prices opened the new week today with a firm tone. Buying interest was centered mainly in the motor and North-western rail shares, but speculative operations also brought moderate advances in a few specialties such as American Type Founders, which rose a point to a new high level for the year.

MONTREAL, June 22.—Cattle receipts 447. There were only a few cattle on sale and prices were fifty cents or more higher on practically all grades. There were no top steers. Medium to good kinds brought from seven dollars to seven-fifty. One odd of fairly good average quality was sold for seven-seventy-five. Choice young cows were sold in mixed lots with good heifers at seven dollars. Good cows in straight lots brought six-twenty-five, and the bulk of the medium cows were sold around five-twenty-five. There were no good bulls offered, common bulls and bulls in fair flesh brought mostly three-fifty.

NEW YORK MARKET

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LEADERS SPEAK AT CONVENTIONS

Premier Veniot at Hampton; Hon. Mr. Baxter at Fredericton.

Candidates are Selected For the Government in Kings, for Opposition in York.

The Government candidates to contest Kings county in the provincial election were selected on Saturday afternoon at Hampton as follows—Sterling I. Keith, of Havelock, Liberal Organizer; Dr. L. S. Murray, Mayor of Sussex; and Edward S. Carter, of Fair Vale. Dr. Frank E. Smith presided. The names of J. D. McKenna and O. W. Wetmore were placed before the convention but each were to be allowed to retire. Dr. Murray and Mr. Keith gave brief addresses.

Mr. Carter asked endorsement of the Grand Falls power development and spoke of the good work done on the roads and bridges of Kings county where more than a million dollars had been spent since 1917, not counting year 1924.

The N. B. Power Co., he said, was now out to defeat the Government and was opposing its development of Grand Falls. Speaking of hydro distribution \$80,000 on the simple voucher of expense. They could form their own conclusions as to where that money went.

PREMIER SPEAKS

Hon. Dr. Veniot said he was appealing to the people on the record of the government about which there was not the slightest shadow of scandal. He said that since the war the province had been going behind industrially and the way out of this was the development of the water power resources and so it had been decided to go ahead with Grand Falls work. The Legislature had decided that the work go ahead. He criticized the leader of the Opposition for his attitude in reference to Grand Falls. So far as markets were concerned there were requests for more power than could be developed at present at Grand Falls. There was absolutely no fear of a market, he said.

OPPOSITION CHOOSES

The three candidates nominated by the Opposition party to contest York county in the provincial election selected on Saturday are Gordon C. Grant, farmer, parish of Canterbury; B. H. Fournier, physician, parish of Manners; and James M. Scott, lumberman, Fredericton. Charles D. Richards, M. L. A., barrister, of Fredericton, was asked to contest the new riding formed in Fredericton, Devon and Maryville.

The two conventions were called in succession by the County Court House in Fredericton. Each candidate upon acceptance made an address. Mr. Richards attacked the Government on its general policies and charged extravagance and explained the Opposition attitude toward hydro development.

Hon. J. B. M. Baxter, K. C., M. P., recently elected Opposition leader, was given an enthusiastic reception. R. B. Hanson, M. P., representing York-Sunbury also dealt with provincial issues.

The speakers said they were in favor of hydro development but suggested that the costs would need close scrutiny. Dr. Baxter dealt with the record of the Government and said that in regard to contracts and the appointment of the new hydro commission the will of the people should rule in spite of what any government might do.

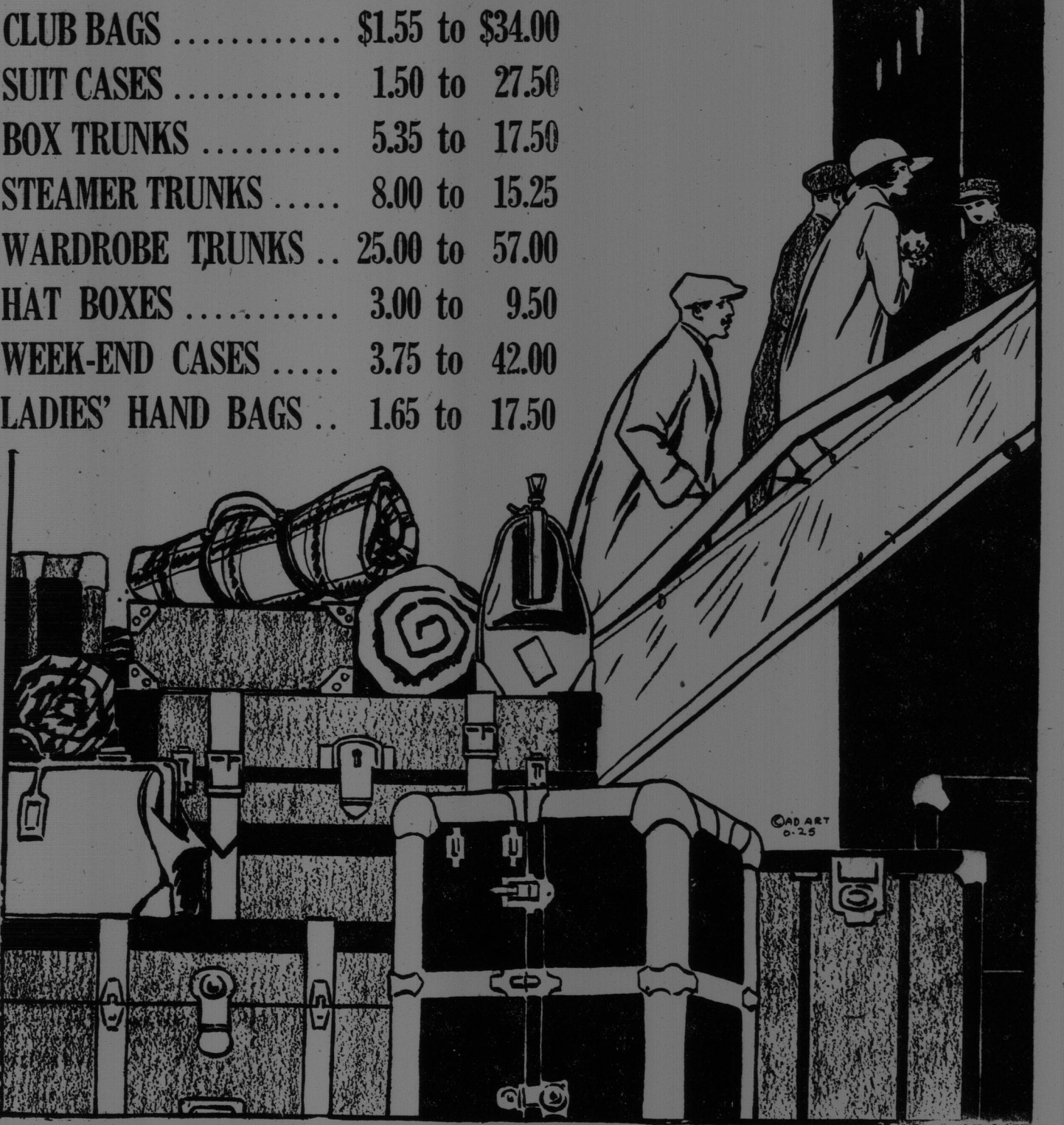
