**TWO FRENCH DELEGATES WERE TURNED BACK**

Not Allowed to Proceed to Meeting of British Labor Party

Paris, June 24—Deputy Jean Longuet, leader of the minority Socialists and M. Frossard, general secretary of the French Socialist party, who were on their way to a conference of the British labor party to be held in Southport, England, were stopped at Folkestone, England, by the authorities and not permitted to proceed to their destination. Other French and Italian Socialists and Laborite delegates, and Hjalmar Branting, Swedish Socialist leader, who crossed on the same boat, were permitted to proceed.

M. Longuet telegraphed to Premier Lloyd George in Paris and Andrew Bonar Law, chancellor of the exchequer, in London, but, having received no reply from them, returned to France.

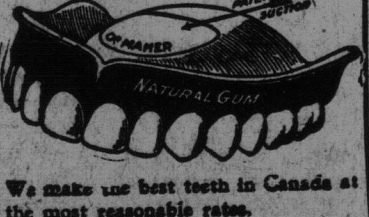
