of \$2,000 without any trouble in straight  
heats and took the \$2,000 stake for 2.14  
pacers in straight heats with Oro Fino,  
stepped to the fastest heat of the day—  
2.06½—in the second heat. Murphy's  
third victory was in the 2.13 trot which  
went to Allan Watts in straight heats.
