## CANADA'S FISHERIES SHOW FALLING OFF

September Yield Less Than in 1911 and There Also is Decline in Six Months

The fisheries of Canada yielded \$1,622,572 in September, compared with \$2,020,384 in September, 1911.

For the six months ended September 30, the value was \$11,345,421, compared with \$11,785,798 in the like period last year.

There was a heavy falling off in September in the catch of salmon, and also a decline in lobster, cod, arctides and halibut; but a small increase in haddock, hake, pollock, and herring, and a considerable increase in mackerel. Some of the figures for September are—

## DUTCH FARMERS FROM SOUTH AFRICA TO COME TO CANADA

Western Report Says 1,500 Will Be Brought by Railway Company

Edmonton, Alta., Nov. 13.—Fifteen hundred experienced farmers of Dutch origin, now living in South Africa, will be brought to northern Alberta by the Alberta, Peace River & Eastern Railway company, which has a dominion charter to build a system of 1,500 miles from Hudson's bay to the Pacific coast by way of Edmonton. The company owns 800,000 acres of land in the Peace River district, which will be developed and settled as rapidly as possible.

## NEWCASTLE WILL HELP PAY EXPENSES OF TAX REFORM LECTURER

Newcastle, Nov. 13.—The Newcastle Board of Trade met last night with Vice-President John Ferguson in the chair, and E. A. McCurdy secretary. Aldermen S. W. Miller, C. Sargent and H. H. Stuart, were appointed to audit the old home week accounts. The secretary was directed to write the Whyte Railway Company guaranteeing heavy support to any reasonable proposition the company might make re establishing their maritime facility here.

On motion of Ald. Stuart, seconded by Mayor Byles, the board decided to guarantee expenses up to \$10 for a lecture one night by any speaker sent to the maritime provinces by the Tax Reform League of Eastern Canada.

The secretary reported that the Maritime Public Works engineer had submitted to the chief engineer plans for a double wharf at the I. C. R. deep water terminus here to accommodate four vessels loading at once. Dredging was being done at similar's mill, and had been finished at Ritchie's, Barclay's, Lynch's and the Swedish Company's mills at Millerton and on the north-west.

It was decided to demand the continuation of the summer daily mail service to Redbank all winter. Mail business on that route had quadrupled in three years, \$20 a month being the money order business at Redbank.

The installation of a mail clerk on the limited train between Campbellton and Moncton had been asked, and would be considered if the limited were not taken off for the winter.

The maritime board's resolutions were endorsed. Efforts were being made to get a telegraph station at Renou and a better train service to Boistown.

Sydney Record—According to McAlpine's new directory, just published, the population of the city of Sydney at the present time is 20,541. The last issue of the directory contained 19,644 names, and the present volume has 6,847 names, an increase of 1,043, or eight per cent for the two years. The usual method of directory publishers is to multiply the number of names by three in order to get what can be relied upon as being about the actual population. Following this method, Sydney is shown to have a population of 24,514.
