DUTCH FARMERS FROM SOUTH AFRICA TO COME TO CANADA

Edmonton, Alta., Nov. 13—Fifteen hundred experienced farmers of Dutch origin, now living in South Africa, will be brought to northern Alberta by the Alberta, Peace River & Eastern Railway company, which has a dominion charter to build a system of 1,500 miles from Hudson's bay to the Pacific coast by way of Edmonton. The company owns 800,000 acres of land in the Peace River district, which will be developed and settled as rapidly as possible.
