LONDON, Jan. 11 — A complete course of military training as a part of national education and creation of a national militia by "voluntary conscription" were advocated for India by Mrs. Sarojina Naidu, first woman president of the Indian National Congress at its recent sitting in Cawnpore.

Mrs. Naidu, originally a Pacifist, declared that the Indians ought to be able to "answer a world challenge to their manhood" and held that military education would provide this ability. The militant president is a poet, who was already writing creditable verse in her teens.
