INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY OF CANADA.

Tenders for Iron Bridge Superstruc-

The Commissioners for the construction of the
Intercolonial Railway are prepared to receive
Tenders for TWENTY ONE SPANS OF IRON
BRIDGE SUPERSTRUCTURE, of one hundred
feet for each span, and also for sixteen span of
Two Hundred feet for each span.
Detailed specifications showing the tests which
each span will be required to bear, information
as to the location of the different bridges, and
forms of tender, can be obtained at the office of
the Commissioners, or at those of the Chief En-
gineer, at Ottawa, Canada; or at the Banking
House of Messrs. Norton, Rose & Co., Bankers,
London, England.

Particulars must be submitted with their own plan
of the bridge, and must show the span of each
span to be, at the place of shipment; and also
the price of each span completed in place.

fications must be submitted within a few days
on or before the date of shipment; and also
