To the Board of Management of the Protestant House of Industry and Refuge.

Gentlemen,—The year just closed has been one remarkably free from any outbreak of disease affecting the old people. The demands upon the medical staff have in consequence been considerably less than in some former years. Owing, however, largely to the number of incurables sent to the Moore Home, the mortality is above the average, as most of those cases are received when their ailment is very far advanced.

Between the three institutions thirtyfour deaths took place during the year, viz.:—
