Choice small pigs sold up to 8c. but that is the outside figure for the best: ordinary pigs sell around 7c. Butter is steady, and choice tubs are firm at our quotations. Eggs are steady. Lambskins are high-Vegetables generally are cheaper. er. There is a great range in the quality of apples offered, and therefore in the prices also. A few blackberries are offered at 10 to 14c per box. Three kinds of cranberries are quoted. Wild duck are now occasionally seen on the market. There is an abundance of both green and ripe tomatoes. The blueberry crop is not yet wholly exhausted.


