

Bye-laws and regulations of the Edmundston sewerage system adopted September 10th A. D. 1918.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF EDMUNDSTON AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Town Council shall appoint a Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector who shall be under the direction and control of the Town Council and shall receive such remuneration for his services as shall be determined by the Town Council.

2. The Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector shall have general jurisdiction over the Sewers and shall see that the same are kept in good order, and shall be responsible for the maintenance of the same. He shall also be responsible for the maintenance of the Sewers and Drains of the Town. He shall have the right to enter upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting the Sewers and Drains, and he shall have the right to require any person to furnish him with such information as he may require for the purpose of carrying out his duties.

3. All applications for connecting with the Common Sewers shall be made in writing, signed by the applicant, which shall specify the purpose for which the connection is required, and shall be accompanied by a plan showing the location of the connection and the proposed sewer line. The Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector shall have the right to require the applicant to furnish such information as he may require for the purpose of carrying out his duties.

4. No person shall connect any private drain or sewer with the Common Sewers without a permit in writing from the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector. The permit shall be subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule of Rates hereinafter mentioned, and shall be subject to the conditions that the person applying therefor shall comply with the By-Laws and Regulations of the Town in reference to excavating the Sewers and Drains, and shall be responsible for the damage or injury caused to persons, animals or property by reason of any neglect or carelessness in the performance of the works permitted, and shall pay the amount specified in the Schedule of Rates hereinafter mentioned.

5. The Town Clerk, on application, is hereby authorized and empowered to grant permission in writing to persons to construct, at their own expense, private drains or sewers to connect with the Common Sewers in any of the streets of the Town, and to be subject to the condition that the persons applying therefor shall comply with the By-Laws and Regulations of the Town in reference to excavating the Sewers and Drains, and shall be responsible for the damage or injury caused to persons, animals or property by reason of any neglect or carelessness in the performance of the works permitted, and shall pay the amount specified in the Schedule of Rates hereinafter mentioned.

6. No person or persons shall make or construct any Drain or Sewers in or through any street, unless such person or persons shall have previously obtained a permit so to do from the Town Clerk.

7. All private Drains or Sewers connected to the Common Sewers shall be constructed and kept in order by the proprietors respectively, and shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent of Sewers, the Engineer or the Inspector appointed by the Town Council.

8. All persons opening or digging up any street or streets for the purpose of putting in private Drains or Sewers shall restore such street or streets in as good a condition as they found them and to the satisfaction of the Street Committee; and in case such person or persons shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions hereof, then such person or persons shall be liable to a penalty of Twenty-Five Dollars and all costs in connection therewith.

9. No person shall injure, break or remove any portion of any Receiving Basin, Covering Flap, Manhole, Vent Shaft, Grating or any other part or parts of any Common Sewers or Drains, or obstruct the mouth of any Common Sewers or Drains or obstruct the flow of water of any Common Sewers or Drains, or in any other way or manner interfere with the Common Sewers or Drains of the Town of Edmundston.

10. All buildings under construction or to be heretofore constructed along streets where the Common Sewers are installed, in the use of which buildings sewerage is required, shall be connected with the Common Sewers or Drains of the Town before such building or buildings is or are occupied by the owner or owners or by any tenant or tenants.

11. All persons who have cesspools in connection with their premises shall connect with the Common Sewers or Drains of the Town not later than the FIRST day of January A. D. 1920. After said date, all such persons shall pay the rates specified in these bye-laws whether such connection is made or not.

12. All owners of premises with latrines or outside closets shall make connections with the Common Sewers or Drains not later than the Thirtieth day of June A. D. 1919. After said date, all such persons shall pay the rates specified in these bye-laws whether such connection is made or not.

13. All connections of private sewer or drain already made with the Common Sewers or Drains of the Town shall be paid the rates specified from the date of such connection.

14. All person or persons or body corporate owning property situate on a street along which there may be a Common Sewer or Drain shall make connection with the same within the time specified in these bye-laws, and in case any person or persons or body corporate do not comply with the requirements of these bye-laws, then and in such case, the Town Council shall have the right to make such connection on behalf of such owner or owners which expense may be collected as a debt to the Town in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

15. The following shall be the rates to be charged for the entrance and use of the Common Sewers or Drains, which shall be paid by the owner or owners of the premises served thereby, semi-annually hereafter in advance, on the First day of January and the First day of July in each and every year:

16. The number of openings or openings into any of the Common Sewers or Drains, and the size and material used in the openings, shall be prescribed by the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector, under the direction of the Town Council.

17. All private drains or sewers shall be laid in such direction, of such size, and with such descent, and where required with such strainers and traps as the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector, shall require under the direction of the Town Council; such drains or sewers shall not, under any pretext, be closed until examined and approved by the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector appointed by the Town Council.

18. No person shall connect any private drain or sewer with the Common Sewers, except by express permission in writing from the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector.

19. No person shall connect any private drain or sewer with the Common Sewers, except by express permission in writing from the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector.

20. No lead, waste or vent pipe shall weigh less than the following, viz:

1 inch in diameter, 6 lbs. per yard	
1 1/2 " " " " " "	7 " "

21. The following sizes of waste pipes for fixtures shall be used, viz:

For waste basin, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For a row of waste basins, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For waste basin overflows, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For bath tub overflows, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For wash tubs, each tub 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For a set of tubs, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For kitchen sinks, 1 1/2 inch diameter	
For each urinal, 1 1/2 inch diameter	

22. No two or more houses or distinct buildings shall have a drain in common, except with the approval of the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector, in writing. Each house or building shall have its own soil pipe and drain, and such soil or drain shall be placed as to be always readily inspected without destruction of the walls of the building. The owner of the house or building shall be responsible for the proper connection of the plumber's work with the sewerage system. All such connections shall be made by one length of cast iron pipe extending horizontally from the inside face of the foundation wall of the building.

23. There shall be suitable clean-outs at all angles of horizontal pipes when the same is possible, and at the foundation walls in direct line with the house sewers, and at other such points as the Superintendent of Sewers, Engineer or Inspector shall direct. Brass screw clean-outs shall be used and all clean-outs shall be accessible.

24. The soil pipe of every building shall be open and uniform in size and carried to a height of not less than two feet above the roof thereof, and not less than five feet above the top of any opening in the same or any other building which is situated within the distance of fifteen feet. All branches of soil or waste pipe which are fifteen feet or more in length, shall be continued at their full size through the roof, or they may be otherwise connected with the main soil pipe by an inverted Y branch at a point above the highest fixture in the building. Any pipe which is less than three inches in diameter and is to be carried through the roof or outside of the building from a point at least one foot before passing through shall be enlarged to a diameter of not less than three inches.

25. All iron pipes upon passing through the roof shall be made water-tight with 4 lbs. sheet lead. Iron pipe used in plumbing shall be coated inside and outside with coal tar pitch applied hot or with some equivalent substance approved by the Superintendent Engineer or Inspector. Joints shall be made with oakum and molten lead thoroughly corked and made tight, and in no case shall putty or cement of any kind be allowed. Connections of lead pipes with iron pipes shall be made of heavy brass. The nuts and corks to the iron, the lead pipes to be attached to the ferrules by a round-wiped soldered joint. All joints made of solder shall be full wiped joints.

26. Every water fixture having a waste pipe connected with the sewer shall be furnished with a separate and suitable trap, placed as near as possible to the fixture that it serves, provided that where a sink and wash tray or basin, or bath tub and wash bowl come in contact with each other, one round trap will be permitted. The waste pipe from the trap in such cases shall be at least one size larger than the inlet pipes. A suitable grease trap shall be connected with the kitchen sink in every hotel, restaurant, public cooking establishment, or such other places as may be required by the Superintendent, Engineer or Inspector.

This and all other traps shall be so placed that they may be easily accessible for inspection and cleaning.

28. All traps shall be protected from siphonage or air pressure by special vent pipes of cast iron, galvanized wrought iron, or brass, of not less than that of the waste pipes which they serve. For water-closet traps they shall not be less than one and one-half inch diameter. Water-closet traps shall be of thirty feet or less than three inch for more than thirty feet.

29. The special venting of the upper fixture may be omitted provided it is a water-closet and is located not more than three feet from the main ventilating stack.

30. Lead vent pipes may be used only when they are readily accessible for inspection and cleaning.

31. Every water-closet or line of water-closets on the same floor shall be supplied with water from a tank of water and the flushing pipe shall not be less than one and one-half inch diameter. Water-closets having flush valves or traps shall be connected to soil pipes by brass flanges or floor plate soldered on the lead pipe. The water-closet shall be securely bolted to the floor plate with rubber-gasket between of sufficient thickness to insure tight and solid joint.

32. No soil water-closet shall be fitted up in any building and no closet or other convenience shall be fitted up of lead, with the exception into the house of air or gas which has been certified in any part of it, or from the vent of soil pipe, or which allows the accumulation of fifth in or about it.

33. Every water-closet located in a location where it is not readily accessible for inspection, shall be provided with a lock which shall be carried upward and into a heated flue or into a fire-brick chimney or in such other manner as the Superintendent, Engineer or Inspector may direct.

34. All plumbing shall be tested by the Superintendent, Engineer or Inspector, and shall include all sewer, soil or waste or vent pipe, lead branches, traps and ferrules, which are interconnected with, and not included in, the water from the Town Water Works System. No test shall be allowed to be connected with the sewerage system except by express permission in writing from the Town Clerk.

35. Wherever in these Bye-Laws and Regulations the words "Superintendent", "Engineer", or "Inspector" appear, they shall include assistant or acting superintendent, Engineer or Inspector, who shall have the right, may be allowed, and shall be held responsible for the proper connection of the plumber's work with the sewerage system. All such connections shall be made by one length of cast iron pipe extending horizontally from the inside face of the foundation wall of the building.

36. These Bye-Laws and Regulations shall form and be considered a part of the contract with any person who has or shall have his premises connected with the Edmundston Sewerage System, and shall be binding on the person or persons who have or shall have their premises connected with the said system, and shall be considered as expressed in the part of such person or persons to be bound thereby.
