According to the most reliable statistics, the Church of England in the British Isles has contributed in the last twenty years \$46,100,000 to Foreign Missions; the Roman Catholic \$840,000; the Church of Scotland \$3.018,000; Non-conformist bodies \$42,600,000.

The fields are white to the harvest, but the labourers are few. The Master calls us all to increased love, to intense zeal, to more thorough consecration.
