Stock Sale at Guelph.
The fifteenth annual sale of registered stock under the auspices of the Guelph Fat Stock Club in the Department of Agriculture was held in the Winter Fair building Guelph yesterday afternoon. The largest crowd of farmers and stock breeders that has attended this sale for many years was present and the quality of the stock was much above the average while the prices were fully up to the high standard of other years.

There were 61 animals offered for sale, and they brought a total of \$12,479. The bulls averaged \$202 each while the heifers' average was \$215. The top price of the sale was \$480 paid by S.R. McBitie of Muncey for a yearling bull bred by W.C. Edwards & Co. of Roseland, Ont., and contributed to this sale.
