Mary, dau. of Jeremiah Burpee, Esq., of Sheffield. Sat for Queen's Co. in Leg. Assem., N. B., from g. e. 1829 to g. e. 1836, when he declined to be re-nominated. Called to the Leg. Coun., 1849.—*Maugerville, N. B.*

JONES, *Hon.* THOMAS R.

B. in Irel. Ed. there. Has been an Alderman of St. John. Appointed to Leg. Council, 1867.—*St. John, N. B.*

LEWIS, *Hon.* JOHN, *J. P.*

Remote ancestors emigrated from Wales to New York about 1730. Grandfather and father, both of whom were U. E. loyalists, came to N. B. at the close of the Am. Revolution. B. at Moncton, N. B., Augt., 1804. Ed. there, and at Halifax, N. S. M., 1st, June, 1829, Miss Lavinia Taylor (she d. 1863); 2ndly, Mary, relict of the late Capt. Wm. Bennett. Sat for Albert, in Leg. Assem., N. B., from Jany., 1852, almost uninterruptedly, up to the Union, 1867, when appointed to the Leg. Coun. Has been a Judge of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas.—*Hillsborough, N. B.*

McINERNEY, *Hon.* OWEN.

Sat for Kent in L. A. of N. B. from 1866 until 1869, when appd. to Leg. Council. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same seat in Commons at g. e. 1867.—*Richibucto, N. B.*
