\$587,600 to \$32,205; tin in blocks from \$549,448 to \$28,681; and spices from \$305,925 to \$56,953. The Dominion's principal exports to the Straits Settlements in 1932 were: Automobiles (\$114,697); rubber manufactures, chiefly tires (\$92,853); automobile parts (\$60,980); milk condensed, etc. (\$17,520); paper (\$14,746); and fish (\$6,634). From 1929 to 1932 there has been a serious decline in the exports to the Straits Settlements of certain commodities, viz.: Automobiles from \$659,454 to \$114,697, and rubber manufactures from \$316,831 to \$92,853.

The statistics in Table III give a more detailed survey of Canada's trade with British India, 1923 to 1932, detailing (1) imports from and (2) exports to; Table IV, similar information for Ceylon for the same years, distinguishing (1) imports from and (2) exports to; and Table V, the trade of the Dominion with the Straits Settlements, 1923 to 1932, segregating (1) imports from, and (2) exports to.

During the latest year for which statistics are compiled, viz.: 1931, Canada's imports from and exports to British India, Ceylon and the Straits Settlements, according to degree of manufacture, were:—

PART II.—TRADE OF BRITISH INDIA, CEYLON AND BRITISH MALAYA

In Part II of this abstract the imports and exports of British India, Ceylon and British Malaya are set forth in rather complete detail for the latest year for which statistics are available, as also the total imports and exports for the past ten years, showing in each instance the amount of the imports and exports for (a) All countries, (b) Empire and foreign countries, and (c) principal countries. The statistics in this part of the abstract present the extent of the import and export trade of these various units of the Empire, as also the classes of commodities imported and exported.

It will be observed by reference to the following table showing the "Trade of British India, Ceylon and British Malaya, year 1930 compared with 1921" that the total trade of these Empire countries with other Empire countries from 1921 to 1930 decreased from \$1,231,900,180 to \$994,271,318, imports from Empire countries decreasing from \$810,598,361 to \$504,265,299; and exports to increasing from \$421,301,819 to \$490,006,019. During the same period imports from Canada increased from \$2,664,678 to \$6,855,501 and exports to from \$7,276,313 to \$9,089,571; imports from the United Kingdom decreased from \$605,991,110 to \$325,764,074, and exports to increased from \$223,625,020 to \$284,444,908; whereas imports from the United States from 1921 to 1930 decreased from \$90,938,151 to \$72,573,020, and exports to increased from \$154,693,290 to \$220,962,306. The imports from all countries from 1921 to 1930 decreased from \$1,274,567,594 to \$1,143,224,504 and exports to increased from \$1,074,690,348 to \$1,287,501,908. Further it will be noted that in 1921 Canada furnished British India, Ceylon and British Malaya combined with 0·2 per cent of their imports, and in 1930 with 0·7 per cent; that the United Kingdom furnished these same British countries with 47·5 per cent of their total imports in 1921, and with 28·5 per cent in 1930; while the United States supplied these British countries with 7·1 per cent of their imports, and in 1930 with 6·3 per cent. With regard to export trade: In 1921, Canada took 0·7 per cent of the total exports, and in 1930, 0·7 per cent; the United Kingdom in 1921 took 20·8 per cent of the total exports, compared with 22·1 per cent in 1930, while in 1921 the United States took 14·4 per cent of their total exports, and in 1930, 17·2 per cent.
