Dear Sir,-

With reference to your letter of yesterday's date, 17956, I beg to say that I have been unable to trace Alex Hunter Edgar Turner on my books. He does not seem to belong to any Agency in Alberta or Saskatchewan - although he may have another name on our books. Consequently I sent the forms addressed to Mrs. Hunter at Fort Saskatchewan, and also a circular letter to all our Agents in that vicinity to make every effort to trace her, advise me of her circumstances, the best means of making provision for her, and asking for whatever information that could be of assistance to us in dealing with her case. I have not heard from her, nor received the forms back, nor received any trace of the woman through our Agents. I would appreciate any information you can send me as to the Agency she belongs to.
