For the week ending 26 Jun, 1819 (1944) Medical Boards were reviewed of which 525 (589) were classified in Category "E".

- (c) Revised Ests for Permanent Hosp installations in Canada have been submitted with an over-all reduction of 623 RCAMC personnel, including 111 MOs.
- (d) Amended instrs have been issued regarding the storage and control of narcotics and restricted drugs.
- (e) A revision of the Mental Standards under the PULHEMS system has been completed.
- (f) A Foot Problem survey is being initiated in MD 2 under the supervision of Consultant Surgeons.

AUXILIARY SERVICES

- 13. (a) Sleeping accn was provided during May in the hostels operated by the Auxiliary Service Orgs at Halifax for 40,409 service personnel.
- (b) A special fund has been set up to establish a wholesale warehouse in Nfld to supply small unit canteens with goods at duty free prices.
- (c) An Offrs Club for all branches of the Service will be opened 3 Jul at 86 Queen's Park, Toronto.
- (d) Funds have been provided for recreational furnishings and eqpt for the CWAC barracks at Washington.
- (e) Construction of three additional sports fields at Camp Borden has been authorized.
- (f) Funds have been provided to purchase property in Brandon to be used as an hostel for service women.
