6. If you have any representations to make, you should make them now to Mr.W.E.Ditchburn, Chief Inspector, at Victoria. Mr. Ditchburn is arranging all the preliminaries, and there will be no opportunity to hear any number of Indians when the final arrangements are made.

7. The Government is endeavouring to arrange with the Government of British Columbia for reasonable reserve allotments based on the findings of the Royal Commission. In addition to these land allotments, the needs of the Indians in the way of education, medical attendance, assistance in farming and irrigation of their lands will be fully considered, but only reasonable compensation will be given.
