

and oohoo fishing station. The next application on the list was for Yu-kus-kum on Hansen Island; the Indians belonging to this Tribe had a handloggers' license, but aside from that a portion of the land covered by this application was apparently vacant, there being about 150 acres in a lapsed timber limit, of which about 20 acres would be cultivable land and the remainder rock. He recommended that old Timber Limit 24794, containing approximately 150 acres, be granted. The land covered by the Sah-pas-di-sila application had been alienated by Pulp Lease, but in any event would be of little use to the Indians or anyone else, for which reason he declined to endorse the application. Between that place and Karlukwess Village, however, there were several small islands which he would recommend to be added to Karlukwess Reserve; he thought that there were three of these small islands, the largest of about half an acre, lying to the east of Karlukwess Village.

Mr. Commissioner Shaw thought that the Commission might properly urge upon the Provincial Government that wherever there was an Indian graveyard, the land so utilized should not be alienated unless by arrangement with the interested Indians. The place known as Usag, covered by another application of this band, was upon Pulp Limit No. 251 and was a long occupied fishing station, where the Indians secured all varieties of salmon. The dog salmon in particular were plentiful in that river and he recommended that five acres be granted at a fishing station. He did not know of any better dog salmon stream or station available to this Tribe. The application for Sagagas, at Gwatsi Lake he declined to support as that place was too far away and in any event the land had been alienated. He recommended that Swansen Island be thrown in with the reserves of this Band and not given to the Mahmahillimillahs
